After the F/G was injured it took a good 15 minutes to get him out of the front turret, as his legs were paralysed. He was given a shot of morphia and left on the bomb-aimer's position until shortly before landing. It then took about 20 minutes to get him onto the bed. The Servo feed worked "miraculously", and there was no gun stopp-page of any kind. Credit is certainly due to these gunners for the efficient way in which they have looked after their guns and turrets. GV tracer in the new belting sequence was considered very satisfactory by the gunners.


